It follows that La Maison l'Arc-en-Ciel in Port-au-Prince must also face this harsh reality and live through more than dark hours

Is it necessary to recall that in 1997, I was very impressed when my friend Alfred Rioux introduced me to Mrs. Danielle and Mr. Robert Pénette and their project of founding La Maison l'Arc-en-Ciel in Port-au-Prince, a home for young Haitians affected by AIDS.

What particularly struck me at the time was to discover a couple of welloff Quebecers with well-established professions deciding to leave their quiet well-being and stability to embark on an uncertain future in order to help a group of the most underprivileged young people on our planet and thus enable them, ultimately, to reintegrate into regular society.

Isn't it comforting to see, after 25 years of hard work, that a good number of these young people have become autonomous, now enjoy a normal existence, earn an honorable living, occupy a place of choice among their fellow citizens and even, in turn, bring a generous and appreciated help to those who follow them and who also benefit from this educational and social integration environment.

Of course, not everyone can travel to Haiti to participate directly in this magnificent project, but one can either provide significant financial support or offer personal prayers for those who are there on the ground to continue this United Nations Organisation recognized charity and ensure its resilience.

Even in my 93rd year, I continue to support as best I can this magnificent work that is La Maison l'Arc-en-Ciel in Haiti and I encourage my many friends and acquaintances to open their hearts and support these young people in need.

Ms. Maher brought her passion with her when she moved to Les Deux Aires residence in Ahuntsic in 2020. In the fall of 2021, she set up an activity she named "The Musical Moment". These beautiful weekly meetings have even been described by one of the participants as a form of personal therapy.

One year later, in November 2022, it was time to celebrate this beautiful year of singing with a show for the residents and their loved ones. Thus, on November 26th, it was with a real pleasure that we attended their performance, witnessing the smiles on their faces and the sparks in their eyes.

To thank Stephane Deschamps, coordinator of the Foundation, for his voluntary involvement in the recording of this precious concert, the choir generously prepared leaflets to present La Maison l'Arc-en-Ciel and to collect donations. This is how the nice sum of \$300 was raised in less than 90 minutes!

We would like to thank the residents, parents and friends for their solidarity towards the children, as well as the staff of La Maison l'Arc-en-Ciel. In this period of extreme uncertainty, we are all inhabited by a feeling of helplessness. However, we still have the will to unite our forces to nourish this essential light for all of us!
